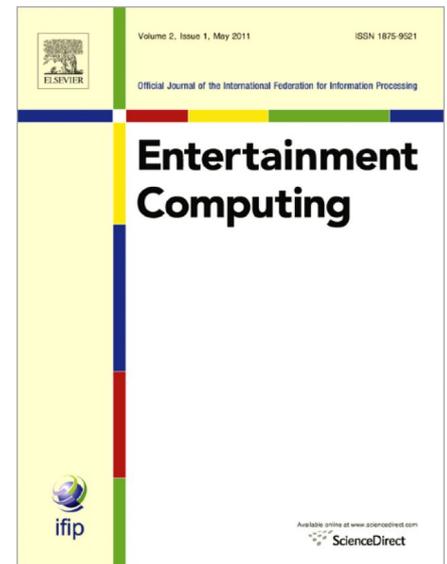

Journal Insights

The Journal Insights pod gives a powerful visual representation of the journal's performance. Displayed on the journal's homepage, the pod uses eight metrics within three key groups (impact, speed, authors). It helps researchers and authors to make better and easier decisions about submitting their work, increasing the chances of relevant, high-quality contributions.

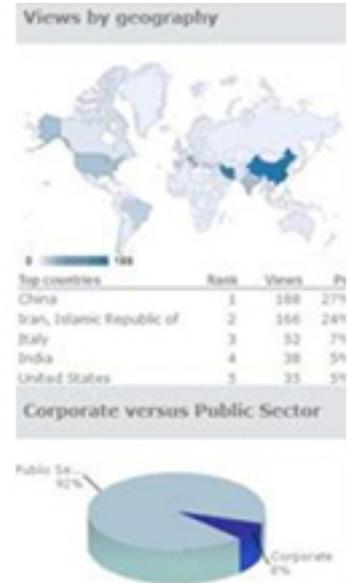
Spotlighting Elsevier's awards and their recipients

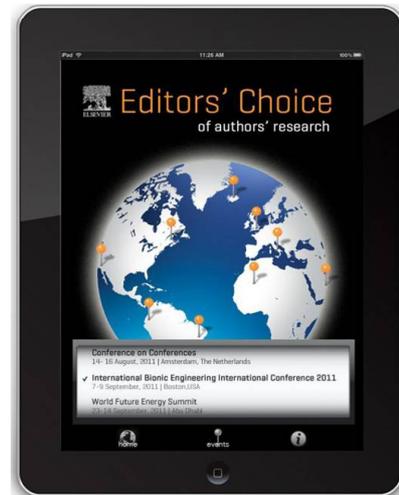

CiteAlert notifies authors when their work is cited in articles published on ScienceDirect. This rapid email notification gives authors:

- An overview of all journals in which their work has been cited
- Insight into their article's influence
- Opportunities for networking and professional collaboration with other researchers



Top-Cited award campaigns

We want to reward those authors whose papers have achieved the top citation rates in our journals. We do this with the annual Top-Cited award campaigns which show recognition for the efforts of influential authors. *Entertainment Computing* was featured in the 2013 campaign.
